Cosmos, Bright Lights #7367 *Graceful flowers, feathery foliage*



Few plants grow as rapidly as cosmos, and fewer still offer such graceful flowers. 2½-3' tall, uniformly growing plants bloom throughout the summer, bearing a profusion of intense semi-double flowers. Foliage is delicate, feathery green. Useful as a background, a border, and as cut flowers.

Hollyhock, Indian Spring #5704

Old-fashioned flower style, tall



These old-fashioned single and semi-double flowers in shades of rose, pink, and white reach a height of 5' and are outstanding in a background or bed of their own. Some hardy biennial hollyhocks don't bloom until the second year, but Indian Spring is an annual.



Ornamental Kale (Flowering Kale) #5625

Holds color into late fall



Pink, purple, and white colors become vivid when cool, fall weather arrives. Plant about mid-June for great fall and winter show. Plants spread about 15" / 38 cm.

Larkspur, Giant Imperial #5708

Abundant, long flower spikes



Larkspur's abundant production of long-lasting, tall, delphinium-like flower spikes on sturdy stems have made it an outstanding favorite for home gardeners and professionals. Plants grow to 4'.

Marigold, Crackerjack #5716

Big blooms on tall stems



These carnation-like flowers often exceed 5" / 13 cm. in diameter on 2-3' / 1 m. stems. Colors include yellow, gold, and orange. Marigolds grow quickly from seed and bloom continuously summer through fall.

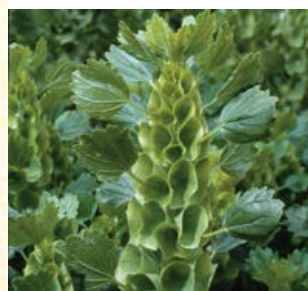

One of the most popular flowering vines, these produce a profusion of 4" / 10 cm., trumpet-shaped flowers. This variety features large crimson-colored, white-throated flowers. The attractive, dark green foliage is very dense, making vines useful for covering trellises, banks, and tree stumps.

Striking Bavarian heirloom

Corn or Flanders Poppy, American Legion #5770

Delicate blossoms in late spring



The delicate, large red flowers are held on 2-3' stems above neat clumps of foliage. The plants do not transplant well but compete well with grass. A European native, it is naturalized throughout the Northeast and Midwest U. S.

Poppy, Shirley Mix #7368

Beautiful, dainty flowers



Spectacular flowers, with fringed, crepe paper-like petals are carried well above the plants on willowy stems. Colors include shades of white, pink, rose, red, and bicolor. Use in mass plantings or blend with other late-spring, early-summer flowers. Excellent for naturalizing in country gardens.

Snapdragon, Tall Mix #5632

Large flower spikes, many colors



This tall mix contains some of the largest snapdragon flowering spikes. 2½' / 76 cm. tall spikes are great for garden color and indoor displays.

Sunflower, Autumn Beauty #6134

Branching plant habit, striking colors



Unusual colors vary from deep yellow to gold and from brick red to burgundy, as well as bicolor flowers with yellow on red or brown on yellow! The semi-double flowers, 5-7" in diameter, are carried on a lush 5-7' tall, branching plant, with good stems for bouquets.

Sunflower, Dwarf Sunspot #5633

Big flower on a 2 ft. stalk

3' tall plants are heavily branched and bloom profusely. Flowers are 4–6" in diameter, and have bright yellow petals around a brown center disc. Excellent for cutting.

Sunflower, Sungold #6645*Stunning double flowers*

Plants reach 5–6' in height and are covered with large, fully double, yellow to golden-orange flowers. Birds are attracted to the small seeds.

Sunflower, Teddy Bear Dwarf #6646*Easy to grow, about 3' tall*

These easy to grow plants thrive in poor soil and produce beautiful, fully double, almost furry, golden-yellow flowers on a dwarf plant. The flowers are striking in the garden and are excellent for bouquets.

Sweet Pea, Explorer Mix #5634*Best dwarf, 16–18" tall, easy to grow*

Explorer is a bush-type mix, unique in that all colors are bred free of tendrils. Colors include mid-blue, crimson, scarlet, rose pink, purple, white, and navy blue. The Royal Horticultural Society and National Sweet Pea Society of Britain rate this mix "Highly Recommended."

Sweet Pea, Old Spice Antiques #5635*Sweetest smelling climber*

Sweet Pea's vigorous, easy-to-grow climbing vines produce an abundance of bright, fragrant flowers in a rainbow of colors from mid-spring into summer. Vines can be trained on trellises, fences, screens, and light posts. Sniff, sniff.

Sweet Pea, Royal Mixed Colors #5897*Heat resistant, large flowers*

Although you may have missed the Royal wedding, this fragrant mix of sweet peas is sure to please. Sow early spring for best results.

Sweet Pea, Streamers Mix #5636*Unusual flecked flowers, sweet fragrance*

A gorgeous mix of flecked flowers in blue, chocolate, lavender, orange, pink, purple, and scarlet. A photo cannot do justice to the impact from just a few of these plants strategically placed. And the fragrance is delightful!



Zinnia, Button Box Mix #5638

Small plants loaded with color



Great for containers or garden beds, Button Box Mix offers cherry red, gold, yellow, pink, pearl, scarlet and cerise. 12" / 30 cm. tall plants put on a big show of 1½" / 3.5 cm. blooms.

Zinnia, Cactus Flower #6967

Delicate quill-like petals

Butterfly Weed is a hardy perennial, native to the United States, and found in 40 states from Florida to North Dakota, from Massachusetts to Arizona. So-called because it attracts butterflies, it is best used in borders and meadows. It does not transplant well.

Columbine, McKana's Mix #6194
The perennial for hummingbirds



An easy to grow perennial and a good choice for a hummingbird garden, Columbine establishes itself the first year and begins blooming the second. McKana's Mix is a large flowered cultivar of the popular species producing graceful, spurred flowers in a variety of colors.

Coreopsis, Double Sunburst #5641
Perennial for cutting, tolerates heat



Coreopsis' bright golden blossoms are carried on graceful, long stems throughout the season. Coreopsis will provide superb cut flowers through summer's heat.

False Rock Cress, Cascade Mix #5643
Evergreen perennial groundcover



False Rock Cress which grows easily from seed sown directly in the garden and forms an excellent ground cover in various shades of blue and purple.

Forget-Me-Not #6128
Easy to grow biennial



These easy to grow, hardy plants bear a profusion of dainty, bright blue flowers in late spring. Excellent interplanted among bulbs and annuals, this old favorite does well planted on the edge of a lawn where it can bloom in spring and be mowed in summer.

Sturdy perennial, reseeds well



One of the most popular wild-flowers, Purple Coneflower is native to the Midwest and Southeast, and naturalized throughout the Northeast. It withstands dry conditions, though it performs best in cooler seasons, without irrigation. It readily reseeds.

Shasta Daisy, Alaska #6010

An ideal choice for cut flowers



Shasta Daisy is a favorite for cut flowers due to its strong 2' stems. Alaska has the largest flowers of the white, daisy-flowered mums. The easy to grow plants are trouble-free bloomers from mid to late summer.

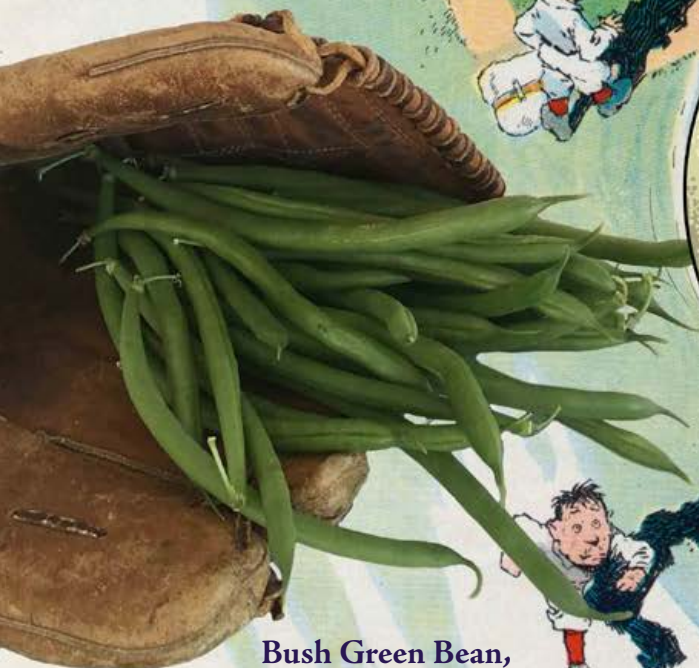
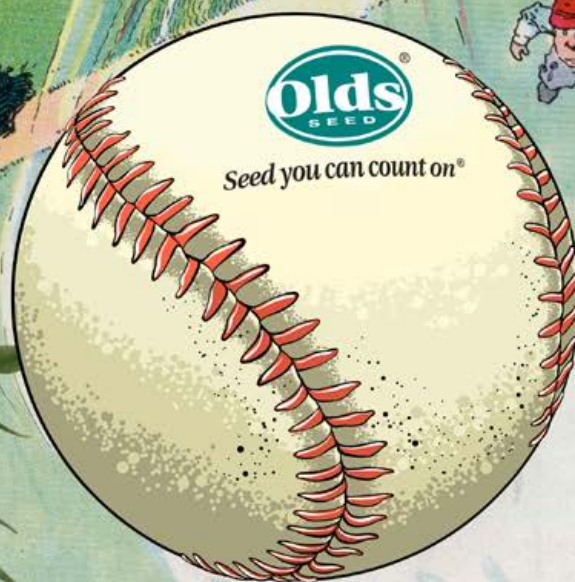
