

ATTRIBUTES & TRIAL DATA

Motley brand triticale is a high performance beardless (awnless) triticale. It is facultative and can be planted spring or fall.

In trials Motley was a top performer. Average height is about six inches shorter than similar varieties but it yields more tons per acre due to an abundance of broad green leaves.

While other varieties achieve high yields by producing long stems, Motley tonnage comes from its leaves. The shorter height reduces the risk of lodging.

Motley is an early maturing variety comparable to Surge. It matures a few days earlier than Gunner, and approximately 8-10 days earlier than FX 1001. Early maturity makes Motley a strong candidate for growers in a corn program.

Motley is a PVP Variety. Unauthorized propagation prohibited. Motley is a TM of Northern Agri Brands, LLC.
